# **Preschool- Fifth Grade**

We have 32 students registered and are averaging twelve students per week. Again, we ask parents/ guardians to drop off and pick up their children at the main doors of our opening area in the basement.

During the month of December we concentrated on the season of Advent and preparing for the birth of Jesus. The students learned about and made an advent candle so they could celebrate the season at home. We also told the story of the birth of Jesus and what that meant to the world- He had come to save us from our sins. Our program on December 18<sup>th</sup>-, "The Gifts of Christmas", went really well. A special thank you to Pastor Beth for coordinating



this program and to Emily and the high school students for helping out as well. We also want to say thank you to Joy Roecker for making new costumes, they looked really great! We hope everyone had a safe and wonderful holiday season and are looking forward to seeing everyone back on **January 8**<sup>th</sup>.

In January, we will celebrate the New Year and start back into Our Gospel Project curriculum- learning that God remained faithful to the covenant that he made with Abraham, and renewed His promises to Jacob, despite his sin. God used Joseph to provide for the people of Israel and bring them into Egypt, which sets the stage for the glorious demonstration of God's power to deliver. We know that nothing can stop God's perfect plan!

Our mission project this year with the offering we collect will be for the Build-A-Bed program. We hope to collect \$200 for this fundraiser, and will have a tracker to show the students' progress towards this mission. So far, we have collected \$73.25 towards our goal.


